



SAFETY POOL RULES

1. All children ages eight years and younger must be accompanied and supervised at all times by a paying adult (age 16 or older).
2. Only US Coast Guard approved floatation devices are permitted. Anyone wearing a floatation device must be directly supervised (within arms reach). No floatation devices may be worn on slides or diving boards. (Water wings, and inner tubes are not permitted.)
3. **CAN WEAR:** Swimsuits, swim-diapers or swim trunks. Rashguards and Under Armour or other comparable swim fabric materials are permitted.
*Cotton fabric exceptions: Only WHITE or LIGHT GREY cotton shirts are permitted.
DON'T WEAR: Colored (cotton) t-shirts*, diapers, thongs, denim, sports bras, socks, undergarments, etc.
4. Swim diapers are required for all individuals who are diaper dependent.
5. Food and drink may be brought into facilities (no glass or alcohol). Management and staff reserves the right to check bags and coolers. Food and drink may only be consumed in designated areas.
6. Shower before entering any pool to prevent Recreational Water Illnesses (RWIs).
7. Decorations are allowed. We request that you take down and/or throw away all Decorations after your event. We do not allow balloons or confetti in the pool area.
8. Tobacco products are prohibited, and all smoking must be done a minimum of 50 yards away from city property.
9. The City of Corpus Christi is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items or goods.

A WORD TO PARENTS:

The Corpus Christi Parks & Recreation staff strives to maintain the highest standards in emergency training. Our goal is to provide patrons with a safe and clean atmosphere in which families can enjoy themselves in a recreation environment. The purpose of the staff is not to supervise your child, but to prevent accidents from happening. Therefore, parents are to closely supervise their child and assist in enforcing the policies for the facility for the safety and enjoyment of all patrons. The City of Corpus Christi is not responsible for injuries or accidents. All children ages eight years and younger must be accompanied and supervised at all times.
